Prepositions of time

- **at** *six o'clock / midday / two o'clock*
*I get up **at** seven o'clock.*
- **in** *the morning/afternoon/evening/night*
*You go home **in** the evening.*
- **on** *Sunday/Sundays, Wednesday/Wednesdays*
*We don't work **on** Fridays and Saturdays.*
- **at** *night*
*They sleep **at** night.*
